








NATIONAL BUILDING RECONCILIATION FORUM (NBRF)

PROGRAM



A Universities Canada initiative, the NBRF annual event stems from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's (TRC) Calls to Action. The aim of the Forum is to support and grow the work of Truth and Reconciliation among key partners such as First Nations, Métis and Inuit Peoples, university administrators, faculty and government policy makers.

This year, NBRF participants will discuss, share best practices, and support participants in exploring critical issues, innovative solutions and approaches related to education for First Nations, Métis and Inuit students. This year's theme is Indigenous Education and Mapping Out Institutional Spaces.

NBRF will facilitate the sharing of knowledge and experience in a wide variety of formats: panel discussions, oral histories, workshops, lectures and presentations from the visual and performing arts. A Vendors/Makers' Market is on site during the Forum. A critical element of the Forum is a direct and collaborative engagement with First Nations, Métis and Inuit communities. The Forum includes an exceptionally diverse program of Guest Speakers, Special Sessions, Elders and Knowledge Keepers all engaged in advancing Truth and Reconciliation in our education systems.
